Eight Steps for Implementing an ERP for Your Fresh Produce Business

Implementing an ERP system is not a simple task—it is normally a matter of months before everything is complete. That being said, it's time well spent, and we're here to help with eight steps to follow for a successful implementation.

1. Make Sure Your Employees Understand the "Why"

As mentioned, getting up to speed with a new ERP platform can take time, as well as money. That begs the question: "Why are we doing this?"

Make clear the advantages of your new system and focus on those benefits that will come once the journey's over. With all eyes on the prize, everyone in the organization will understand the purpose behind their work.

2. Have Clear and Quantifiable Objectives

It might seem obvious, but you need to set a clear end point. ERP implementations that exceed their anticipated time frame are likely seen as “unfinished” simply because no one established the measurable goals by which you can determine your progress.

Envision your perfect end-state, then lay it out in front of your employees and keep track of the milestones you pass along the way. Your people will seize upon the momentum and believe that the destination is worth the work required to get there.

Everyone in the company needs to understand the value of the new system and what it will mean for the consistency and efficiency of **all business processes.**



3. Define Your Critical Processes

This step requires input from the whole team, so bring your management and key users together to explore your processes and identify the ways in which they need to be improved. When they focus on their pain points and how your ERP solution will alleviate them, they’ll see the importance of the project and why they need to dedicate their energy to it.

4. Get Buy-In from Top to Bottom

It’s not enough that your leaders feel ownership over the process—everyone in the company needs to understand the value of the new system and what it will mean not only for their own day-to-day tasks, but also for the consistency and efficiency of all business processes.

Can you imagine a task as tall as putting a new ERP system in place succeeding when only a select few believe in the value of the results and their work toward them? That’s why this step is so vital. Everyone needs to understand the importance and how this new solution will help support their job responsibilities and tasks.

5. Starting the Project

This probably sounds simple and obvious, but beginning the project the right way is crucial. You should have a kick-off of sorts—an in-person or virtual event—in which you do the following:



1. Ensure everyone is aware of why the implementation is occurring and what the advantages of the new system will be



2. Clearly explain the timeframes of the various phases



3. Stress how important success in this endeavor really is



4. Create an internal name for the project that emphasizes the benefits



5. Host weekly progress meetings for the team and key stakeholders



6. Regularly provide updates to the entire company on progress via a newsletter or employee town hall

With good communication and the whole team on the same page, your implementation will get off on the right foot.
